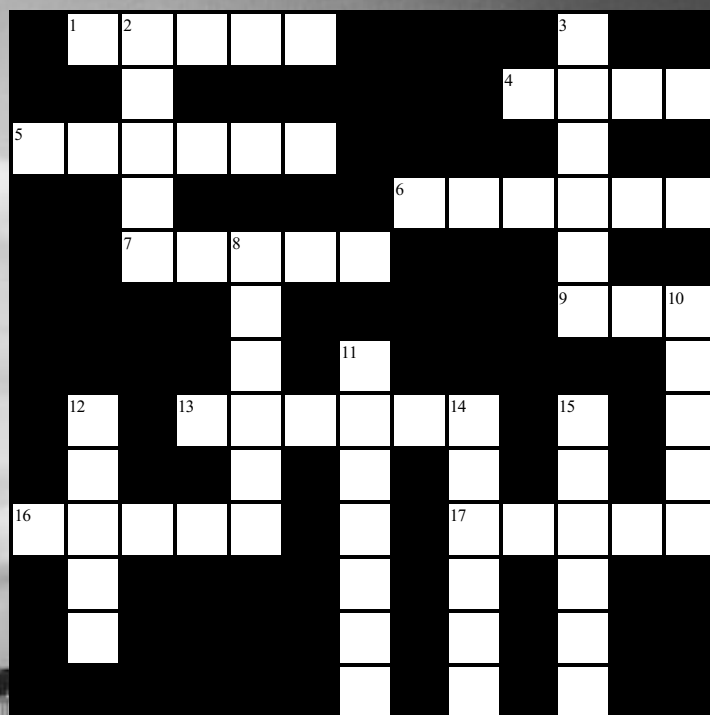


An advanced level crossword for English language learners
